Follow these simple rules when viewing
wildlife

Responsible Wildlife Viewing

Wildlife viewers should watch wildlife without bothering or interfering with their normal activities. This provides a satisfactory viewing experience for the watcher without causing undue harm or stress to the animal.

The welfare of the animal always comes first, so be prepared to follow these guidelines before you head out to catch a glimpse of the Hocking Hill's wild residents.

Respect Wildlife

Don't feed wildlife!

View animals from an appropriate distance.

Avoid surprising wildlife, which can be dangerous.

Stay clear of nests, dens, or other areas that are vulnerable to human disturbance.

Stay in small groups to cause fewer disturbances.

Limit your stay.

Respect Wildlife Habitat

Stay on the trail.

Don't litter.

Don't disturb the habitat in any way

Respect Other Viewers and Property

Respect the rights of your fellow wildlife viewers.

Respect the rights of property owners.

Spread the word about responsible wildlife watching behavior.

Respect the WILD in Wildlife
